Under the direction of the coordinator, this position will provide assistance for the development, administration, and evaluation of activities that facilitate indigenous K-12 student and family understanding of how to prepare for and pay for college. The position may also assist with on-campus visitations of students and families.

Coordinate, plan, and facilitate campus visitations and engagements from K-12 indigenous students Partner with K-12 educators to understand student and family needs related to planning for college. Collaborate with campus partners to ensure participants benefit from all relevant UA resources Track participant data and prepare reports as needed. Perform related duties in support of the Native American Science & Engineering Program and Early Academic Outreach as assigned.
