- 4. The lessons we take from obstacles we encounter can be fundamental to later success. <u>Recount a</u> <u>time when you faced a challenge, setback, or failure. How did it affect you, and what did you learn</u> <u>from the experience?</u> (*Limit 1800 characters with spaces*)
- 5. Choose three words that best describe you. Tell us why you chose those words. (Limit 1800 characters with spaces)
- 6. What additional information (not already addressed in this application) do you wish to share with the NASEP review committee? (*Limit 1100 characters with spaces*)
